It's time for a friendly reminder about responsible pet ownership in our beautiful town. Lately, we've been receiving quite a few concerns about unleashed dogs and uncollected dog waste in our public areas. Let's all do our part to keep Cunderdin clean and safe for everyone! We've heard troubling reports of children coming across dog waste in the little kids' play area at O'Connor Park. We've also heard from athletes and sports lovers who've encountered dog waste while out on the oval. Let's keep our playing surfaces clean and enjoyable for everyone!

Here are the guidelines we need to follow:

• Keep all dogs on a leash when in public areas (that includes the oval and

O'Connor Park)

- Please carry your own dog waste bags.
- If you did forget the bags, we have dog waste bags available at the oval and O'Connor Park for your convenience.

Consequences for not following the rules:

- Failure to clean up after your dog: \$200 fine.
 - Dogs off-leash in public areas: \$1000 fine.

If you see any instances of dogs off-leash or uncollected waste, please don't hesitate to reach out to the Shire of Cunderdin. We're here to help keep our town clean and safe for everyone.

Let's work together to ensure Cunderdin remains a wonderful place for both humans and our furry companions alike!

His tireless efforts have not only enhanced the aesthetic appeal of our community but have also fostered a sense of pride and unity among its residents.


Rex embodies the true spirit of community service and sets an inspiring example for us all. His commitment to making our town a more beautiful place is truly commendable and greatly appreciated.

RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD 4 October - 1 November 2023 PERMITS REQUIRED

PROHIBITED BURNING PERIOD 2 November 2023 - 28 February 2024 BURNING PROHIBITED

RESTRICTED BURNING PERIOD 15 February - 31 March 2024 PERMITS REQUIRED
